

HAU'S APPEAL FAILS.

**Court Refuses Convicted Murderer
New Trial—Will Try Again.**

LEIPSIC, Germany, Oct. 15.—The Supreme Court to-day rejected the appeal of counsel for Karl Hau, formerly of Washington, for a revision of the sentence condemning him to death for the murder of his mother-in-law, Frau Molitor.

It is understood Hau's lawyers, expecting that the Supreme Court would refuse to grant the appeal for a revision of the death sentence, already had laid plans to move for a retrial. These plans have not been divulged in detail, but they probably will be based upon statements made by various witnesses who have been discovered since the time of the first trial. A retrial can be secured only upon the offer of important new testimony.

It is regarded here as extremely doubtful that Hau will get a new trial.
