

HAU NOT LIKELY TO DIE.

Grand Duke of Baden Is Strongly Opposed to the Death Penalty.

BERLIN, July 24.—It is known that the Grand Duke of Baden is strongly opposed to the death penalty, and consequently it is believed that he will commute the death sentence imposed by the Court at Karlsruhe upon Karl Hau for the murder of his wife's mother to imprisonment for life, particularly as he has taken similar action in a large number of previous cases.

Prof. Aschaffenburg, a distinguished psychologist, sat in the courtroom and listened closely to the testimony during the four days of the Hau trial. He wrote to Herr Dietz, counsel for Hau, before the conclusion of the trial, that he was obliged to leave Karlsruhe, but he had not the least doubt that Hau would be acquitted. "In spite of the fact that much remains in darkness," the Professor said, "I am convinced that Hau did not commit this murder."
